3. (a) How does Utterson describe Hyde? (b) How is this similar to Enfield's description?
4. (a) What crime does a servant girl witness? (b) How is she able to identify the assailant?
5. What vow does Henry Jekyll make to Utterson after the Carew murder?
6. (a) What becomes of Hyde after the Carew murder? (b) What effect does this have on Henry Jekyll?
7. Why does Dr. Jekyll's servant Poole send for Utterson?
8. What does Utterson find in Dr. Jekyll's laboratory?
9. (a) What is Jekyll's stated purpose in first concocting his potion? (b) Is he being honest with himself?
10. Jekyll refers to Hyde as his "impenetrable mantle." Is Hyde really a mask for Jekyll to wear, or is Jekyll the mask and Hyde the true man underneath?
